National Association of Antique Automobile Clubs of Canada

February 2002

The NAAACCC has had a very busy and productive 2001. Major alliances were formed with the Specialty Vehicle Association of British Columbia, the Specialty Vehicle Association of Ontario and the Coalition of Concerned Collector Car Clubs. We now have over 400 clubs in our membership Canada-wide. In British Columbia we have had seven new clubs join our association in the past five months. We wish to welcome the Sunshine Coast Drag Racing Association, BC, Triumph Registry, Regional Group 120, Vancouver Fraser Valley Early Ford V/8 Club of America, Totem Model A&T Ford Club, Pacific Model A Ford Club, and the Pacific International Street Rod Association.

The SVA-BC and the Vintage Car Club of Canada and the SVA-Ontario have been a great help in hosting us on their web sites. Our own web site www.naaaccc.ca is managed by NAAACCC director Wilfred Moase from P.E.I. It contains the latest information regarding restrictive legislation, judging guidelines, safety, pollution control and information regarding Bill C-32. It also has links to many organizations including (FIVA) the world governing body of collector motor vehicles, often referred to as the International Federation of Ancient Motor Vehicles www.FIVA.org consists of 36 member countries and 53 Associations. I have provided each Provincial NAAACCC representative with 7 updates during these past 11 months, along with the latest updates dealing with Bill C32. Please refer to the January 2002 Bill C32 update for background information.

It is very important that the Canada Wide Collector Vehicle Survey's that are now in circulation are returned no later than May 1, 2002. We will be starting a Federal lobby in the fall of 2002. We will be asking for a Canada-Wide Air Care Testing Exemption using the statistics from the survey. Ontario already enjoys this exemption as their politicians are astute enough to realize that collector vehicles are driven very few miles per year and that attrition will take care of those few vehicles that are used for normal transportation. Recent survey's show that the miles put on collector vehicles in Ontario average 405 miles per year.

The Ontario government had the insight to recognize that collector vehicles are well maintained and do not present a significant pollution problem. The literally millions of dollars that the collector vehicle hobby brings to our communities, coupled with the Heritage benefits are viewed as extremely positive contributions to Canadian society.

In closing, I would like to thank all of you for your continued support. The NAAACCC is working hard so that we may all continue to enjoy a hobby that connects our Heritage, educates our youth, and brings a greater prosperity to our communities.

JCNA Show and Slalom AGM ~ March 23rd.

National Concours score is a base 100 number using average of three best concours scores, **Slalom**; the competitor's time is calculated to a percentage of the fastest time within his/her class thus becomes a base 100 number.

Rally, competitor's error time is calculated to a percentage of the winning error time for each of his/her best two rallies then averaged to get a base 100 number. Addition of the three base numbers result in an aggregate score, highest score receives the award. The same method of calculating the base number would apply to the Novice Rally Program and the Concours Driven Division.

c) Slalom Rules ~ Bill Streitenberger

Presently there are 24 Official Slalom Rules posted on the JCNA web and are presumed to be official. Rule #9 States: Cars must have Jaguar engines, and fit into designated Concours (*Champion*

Division), Driven (*Driven Division*) and slalom classes to be eligible for JCNA National Slalom Championship Trophies.

Rule #10 States: Only one trophy per year, per driver, is allowed, this being 1st, 2nd, or 3rd based on their fastest single run.

My Proposal for rule #10: Only one trophy, per class, per year, per driver. If the driver enters in multiple classes with a different Jaguar in each class the driver becomes eligible for a National trophy in each class depending upon his/her time.

If a member wants to compete in one or more Jaguars, more power to that member and if that member has the best time in one or more classes, reward his efforts.

Rule # 20 was changed to read: Any car in stock class may use any road tire fitted to a stock dimension rim appropriated to the class. This rule was changed without AGM delegate approval.

Rule #20, (Read as follows before it

was indiscriminately changed) Car must be completely stock including wheels, tires*, suspension, and ride height, or will be classed as modified. Final determination of eligibility will be made by the local steward.

b) Regional Awards. ~ Art Dickenson.

Discussion: Currently National Award winners in first 3 places are ineligible for Regional Awards. **Proposal:** To make the highest point cars the Regional Award winners, to 3 places, without regard to their standings in the National Awards. A participant could thereby receive 2 awards, a National Championship Division award and a Regional Championship Division award.

c) Additional Slalom Rules for 2002 ~ Art Dickenson

2. All drivers and/or passengers must keep arms and hands fully inside the passenger compartment at all times while car is on the course. No leaning on window sills or holding onto door jambs or window frames. Slalom steward may disqualify any violator from further competition in that day's event. Slalom stewards decision is final.

3. The new X Type will be added to Slalom Class K.





Pleasure use?

From Ron Holmes - BCAA

I enjoyed the time I spent with the Canadian XK Register / Classic MG Club members recently and look forward to a follow up visit sometime within the next year or so.

For the information of the members who seemed to be somewhat concerned over what BCAA defines "pleasure use" driving. I am including BCAA's definition which forms part of the policy. "The vehicle is driven 8,000 miles or less per year, unless entered in an official long distance road race or rally; will be operated for transportation to and from and used in exhibitions or club activities of Antique and Modern Collectible Car Clubs, parades and other like functions, and for the purpose of obtaining vehicle repairs and servicing, but not for general transportation; and will not at any time be used for driving to and from or part way to or from work or school or used in business or commercial use."

This should help reassure members who were concerned that their insurance could be invalid if they stop at a drug store or shopping mall during a Saturday or Sunday run.






